

The Rule of Thirds

in photography

The theory of the Rule of Thirds is that if you place points of interest in the intersections or along the lines that your photo becomes more balanced and will enable a viewer of the image to interact with it more naturally.

Studies have shown that when viewing images that people's eyes usually go to one of the intersection points most naturally rather than the center of the shot.







Landscape Rule of thirds


A good technique for landscape shots would be to position horizons along one of the 2 horizontal lines.


